Introduction

- ► The Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990
- A civil rights law to prohibit discrimination solely based on:
 - ▶ disability in employment,
 - ▶ state and local government,
 - ▶ public accommodations,
 - ► commercial facilities,
 - ▶ transportation and telecommunications.



Introduction

- Annually 356 Milion amputations worldwide(1)
- In US, the prevalence of limb loss was 1.6 million people in the year 2005; its estimated to increase to 3.6 million people by the year 2050 (2)





Introduction

- The total projected lifetime healthcare costs after lower limb amputation is estimated at \$509,275 per patient.(3)
- ▶ 42% of patients reported being unable to work for 7 years following their lower limb amputation, further exacerbating the financial and psychological burden (4)

Amputee Care

Discrimination of individuals with disabilities in access to prosthetic and orthotic devices necessary for physical activity due to inadequate insurance coverage.



Amputee Care

- Movement is medicine and physical activity is a right, not a privilege.
- ▶ People with disabilities who are physically active are more likely to be:
 - employed,
 - advance in their careers,
 - and have improved physical and mental health.[5]



What is SEBCM?

So Every BODY Can Move (SEBCM) is a grassroots initiative by AOPA to create change through state-by-state legislative action and expanding access to medically necessary P & O care





Origins of SEBCM

- Jordan Simpson & Rep. Colleen Madigan
- May 2022 State of Maine passed Bill LB 1003 -"An Act to Improve Outcomes for Persons with Limb Loss"
- Requires Commercial Insurance Companies to cover Activity Prosthetics for children to age 17.











- August 2022 Rep. Lee Johnson, MD.
- January 2023 HB1252 filed in House

"TO MODIFY THE ARKANSAS HEALTH CARE CONSUMER ACT; AND TO REQUIRE COVERAGE FOR PROSTHETIC DEVICES FOR ATHLETICS OR RECREATION AND PROSTHETIC DEVICES FOR SHOWERING OR BATHING"

- March 2023 Sen. Missy Irvin in Senate
- April 2023 Gov. Huckabee-Sanders signed
