
# Telehealth Definitions


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


The purpose of this handout is to help navigate the use of the various terms and definitions by presenting current use of terms, definitions, and recommendations for choosing definitions.

# TELEHEALTH, TELEMEDICINE, OR DIGITAL HEALTH?

Entities use "telehealth" and "telemedicine" either interchangeably or recognize them as two distinct terms. "*Telemedicine*" is considered the more granular term referring to clinical patient care. Generally, the larger umbrella term of telehealth encompasses health education, administration, and public health. The term "digital health" is most commonly used as an overarching term that includes both "telehealth" and "telemedicine" as subterms.





### INTERCHANGABILITY OF "TELEHEALTH" AND "TELEMEDCINE"

Legislators and policymakers are more likely to use the terms interchangeably rather than defining a distinction between the terms which could lead to confusion when putting laws and policies in practice.
