BE FAST Poster!





#BEFASTForKids


Teaching children the signs and symptoms of a stroke is very important, and in the month of August, we did just that!

Each week, opportunities for active and passive activities were shared with partner hospitals to encourage student outreach.




Stroke Program Activity Books

#BEFASTForMinorities

In September, we focused on educating the Hispanic Community on their risk factors and the signs and symptoms of a stroke.

Did you know? Among Hispanic adults, 2.8% of men and 2.0% of women have had a stroke.

Did you know? Spanish-speaking Hispanics are less likely to know all stroke symptoms compared to English-speaking Hispanics, non-Hispanic blacks, and non-Hispanic whites. Lack of English proficiency is strongly associated with lack of stroke knowledge among Hispanics.




October Upcoming Events
